THE CONSTRUCTION CODES

COMMITTEE monitors issues relating to building codes, construction standards and materials, construction technology, and code enforcement.

THE GREEN BUILDING

TASK FORCE has responsibility to: (1) draft legislation incorporating definable, quantifiable and balanced green building practices; (2) analyze existing green building standards; and, (3) create educational and marketing programs that promote green building.



THE ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS

COMMITTEE examines pertinent environmental issues that influence the building industry in New Jersey. The committee's efforts have resulted in some very significant regulatory and legislative victories for the building industry.

THE LAND USE AND PLANNING

COMMITTEE assesses and responds to developments in the areas of: land use, planning, affordable housing, site improvements and infrastructure, impact fees, taxes and related matters. The committee screens legislative and regulatory proposals, policy interpretations, and solicitations for comments.

THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TASK FORCE evaluates affordable housing issues and the activities of the Council on Affordable Housing. It guides NJBA policies relating to housing for those of modest means.

THE HIGHLANDS COMMITTEE evaluates public policies governing housing and employment opportunities in the Highlands region.

THE PINELANDS COMMITTEE monitors activity of the Pinelands Commission and evaluates public policies governing housing and employment opportunities in the Pinelands region.

**THE LEGAL ACTION
COMMITTEE** reviews and determines the extent of NJBA participation in matters of litigation affecting building in New Jersey.



THE LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE studies state laws, bills and regulations affecting building in New Jersey, and establishes positions for NJBA in these instances. The committee develops new laws, bills and regulations that it deems necessary to amend existing laws, bill and regulations that are of interest to the building industry.

THE REDEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE considers all matters relating to the creation of housing and employment opportunities in previously developed areas. Redevelopment issues have become increasingly important as more members build urban redevelopment projects into their business plans.

THE ASSOCIATES COMMITTEE represents the interests of the NJBA's members: those who provide services and products to builders. The committee promotes NJBA's events, recognizes the achievements and contributions of the Associate members and builds relationships between the Associate and Builder members.

THE CONVENTION COMMITTEE directs the planning of the Atlantic Builders Convention (ABC), including the trade show, special events, award ceremonies, selection of keynote speakers and celebrity guests, and the new officers installation banquet. The ABC is the most prestigious and important building industry event of its kind on the East Coast.

THE GOLF COMMITTEE is responsible for the successful planning, marketing and advertising of the Annual Golf Outing. This is accomplished by preparing a budget, reporting income and expenses while securing registrations, sponsorships and providing fun prizes/awards for participants.

THE MEMBER EDUCATION AND SERVICES COMMITTEE plans and implements NJBA's continuing education program for members, including the technical seminars at ABC. The committee assists local associations in their recruitment and retention of membership.

THE MEMBER MOBILIZATION TASK FORCE works to identify, inform, educate and motivate people impacted by issues related to housing, so they will act to further the interests of the building industry in New Jersey. The Task Force closely works with NJBA's Ambassadors for Housing - key employees of each of NJBA's member companies that help to further the industry's message with their co-workers.

THE INDUSTRY FINANCE COMMITTEE considers all pertinent matters involving industry finance, including acquisition, development, construction, and end-loan finance, which influence the building industry in New Jersey. The Committee monitors the policies and actions of Federal and State agencies responsible for the regulation and supervision of financial institutions and markets affecting the building industry.

THE 50+ HOUSING COUNCIL addresses issues of importance to the housing needs of an aging population. The council offers popular educational Breakfast Seminars and provides networking opportunities for those involved in this growing market.

THE SALES AND MARKETING (SAM) COMMITTEE is responsible for the annual SAM Awards & Gala Banquet, the East Coast's most prestigious program for new home sales and marketing achievements. The SAM Awards recognize the builders and their associates who have made major contributions to promoting new housing in New Jersey.

THE QUALITY CONSTRUCTION TASK FORCE (QCTF) puts forth recommendations for legislative, regulatory and administrative changes in response to the 2005 report by the State Commission of Investigation (SCI) on home building in New Jersey.
